

## **Mission's Highlights**

### **NORTHERN NIGERIA MISSION FIELD**

### North West – Kebbi and Niger States

Strategic soul-winning, discipleship, and leadership training commenced early in the year among the Kambari, Dukawa, and Fulani people groups. We thank God for the deliverance of one of our missionaries' wife and son at Maigere after a ransom of N3 million and food items was paid.

At Acuku, due to exponential church growth, disciples voluntarily pulled down the old structure in faith for a new one. We are trusting God for the completion of the new church building.







### **Mission's Highlights**

### North East – Bauchi and Surrounding Areas

Remarkable growth was also recorded. New churches were planted, leaders were trained, and many souls were won to Christ, particularly in Ganjuwa. Two more churches were established in Bauchi, and our two damaged motorbikes were successfully repaired. Disciples at Kwanan Kuka are currently rebuilding their church facility.









## **Mission's Highlights**

### Zonal Mission Office and Training School – Zul, Bauchi

A new zonal mission office and training school has been established in Zul, just 15 minutes from Bauchi. The first batch of students has commenced registration and training, marking a new era in equipping indigenous missionaries.









## **Mission's Highlights**

### **Arewa Mission Conference 2025**

The second edition of the Arewa Mission Conference was a resounding success.Participants from across 8 states—Kebbi, Niger, Kaduna, Plateau, Kano, Gombe, Adamawa, Yobe, and Bauchi—gathered for impartation and training.

- 402 people trained
- 26 souls led to Christ
- Over 500 Bibles distributed
- 3 unreached people groups engaged
- 2 churches planted
- 130 received free medical care
- (53 free drugs, 7 divine healings)

















## **Mission's Highlights**

### **NIGER REPUBLIC**

At Isakabar, the number of disciples has grown, leading to the commencement of two regular services. Many secret believers are also coming to Christ. A solar-powered borehole project has been initiated with N1.2 million disbursed. Additionally, a literacy and discipleship school is actively running in Gidan Bawa, transforming the lives of unschooled youths.







## **Mission's Highlights**

### **REPUBLIC OF BENIN**

By God's grace, five new churches were planted, including a Fulani congregation. The converts took the initiative to fundraise for building materials, and the ministry supported them to complete the structures. Indigenous missionaries continue to labor tirelessly to reach their people.







# Mission's Highlights

Outreaches, church planting, training, and empowerment projects continued in Togo. New churches were planted in Akparaou and other communities. Support items provided include:

- 2 motorbikes for missionaries
- 1 speaker for an evangelist
- Drum sets and 20 benches for new churches

Kadanga Mission Church was rebuilt after being destroyed by a windstorm, with N900,000 donated by a partner. A retreat was also organized for church leaders and deacons.







## **Mission's Highlights**

### **COTE D'IVOIRE**

The Rubino community church continues to grow. Outreaches at Kappemaoule witnessed salvations and restorations. The missionary's rent has been renewed, and evangelistic work is ongoing.







### **Mission's Highlights**

### GAMBIA

The Gospel reached an Arabic training centre and four new communities in the lower region. A new church was planted, and leadership and discipleship training sessions were organized for young believers and indigenous leaders.





## **Mission's Highlights**

### **GUINEA BISSAU**

Growth at the Biombo community is evident both in numbers and discipleship. In Blimat, souls were won, and clothes were distributed. A mission land was acquired for FCFA 250,000 for church and school use.







## **Mission's Highlights**

### SIERRA LEONE

Our activities recorded tremendous impact:

- 10,000 souls led to Christ
- New churches planted
- 8th anniversary held in Kono District
- Foundation Day celebrated at Krutor Senior Secondary School
- Inter-house sports held at Waidala Primary School
- Leadership trainings in Falaba and Koinadugu
- Bibles distributed across four districts

Infrastructure projects included roofing our secondary school, fixing two motorbikes, and completing land surveys. Water projects and a health centre are also in progress.







## **Mission's Highlights**

### LIBERIA

A mini-conference was held at Walodou community with over 400 disciples. Church planting began in Zorzor District, alongside leadership restructuring. Mission churches at Sangbawale and Wawokolou were completed and roofed.





## **Mission's Highlights**

### **GUINEA CONAKRY**

Thousands of souls were saved. Churches were planted, over 100 converts baptized, and hospital outreaches conducted. Five churches are under construction. A new motorbikeand strategic land in Ouende Kenema have been secured for training and empowerment.





## **Mission's Highlights**

### CAMEROON

Our missionary work in Doulek commenced with impactful evangelistic outreaches, resulting in over 200 souls surrendering their lives to Christ. The move of God in the community was undeniable, as hearts responded eagerly to the Gospel message. Following this harvest of souls, a home cell was planted to provide a nurturing environment for discipleship and spiritual growth among the new believers. Recognizing the need for sustainable follow-up and engagement, audio Bibles were generously distributed to the converts—many of whom are either non-literate or have limited access towrittenScripture.







## Mission's Highlights CHAD

Despite facing challenges, including the eviction of Pastor Malaah, our mission work in Chad continues to advance by God's grace. The commitment of our team remains strong, and the Gospel is still being shared. We are prayerfully trusting God for a physical visitation soon to strengthen the work and encourage the faithful laborers on ground.







## **Mission's Highlights**

### SENEGAL

Pastor Eloi Niakh became part of the team, receiving consistent support and encouragement as he pursued his mission in collaboration with Abdoul. Their partnership continues to thrive, strengthened by shared vision and commitment, as the team remains dedicated to empowering their efforts and advancing the work they've been called to fulfill within their assigned region.









## **Mission's Highlights**

### TANZANIA

Outreaches, school evangelism, and leadership training sessions were carried out effectively. The missionary residence in Busulua progressed to lintel level, while construction of the Ibanda church continues. Additionally, the mission farm harvest was successfully completed, marking a season of growth and productivity in both spiritual and structural dimensions of the mission's work.







## **Mission's Highlights**

### BURUNDI

Through door-to-door evangelism in Gatumba and nearby areas, 173 souls were won to Christ. In addition, twenty leaders are currently undergoing periodic training to strengthen their capacity and deepen their impact. These efforts reflect a growing momentum in both evangelistic outreach and leadership development within the region.

### CONGO DR

In Bukavu, the civil war presented serious threats, but God faithfully preserved our people. Despite the unrest, souls are still being saved, and the work continues. We remain steadfast in prayer, trusting God for lasting peace and divine provision to sustain and expand the mission in this challenging region.







## **Mission's Highlights**

### **KENYA**

Missionary efforts began in Migori County:

- 111 souls saved
- 8 communities reached
- 2 churches planted
- 35 missionaries trained













## **Mission's Highlights**

### MALAWI

Two new churches were planted in Buwa and Mchinji, reaching four communities with the gospel. Over 300 souls were saved, and 63 leaders were trained to support the growing work. Although the Mponera church project faced setbacks due to heavy rains, rebuilding efforts are actively underway, reflecting resilience and commitment to the mission's vision.






## **Mission's Highlights**

### ZAMBIA

A motorcycle was purchased to support the missionaries in Petauke, enhancing mobility and outreach. The church building in Ndake was successfully roofed, marking a key milestone. Meanwhile, regular training sessions for indigenous leaders continue, equipping them for effective ministry and strengthening the foundation for sustainable growth across the region.







## **Mission's Highlights**

### ZIMBABWE

In Goromozi, 44 souls were saved, and one church was planted, reaching four communities with the gospel. Additionally, a leadership training session was conducted, equipping local leaders to further advance the mission and strengthen the spiritual foundation in the area. The work continues to bear fruit, expanding God's kingdom in the region.







### **Mission's Highlights**

### MOZAMBIQUE

The disciples remain steadfast in their faith, continuing to trust God for a church building. Despite challenges, their commitment grows stronger as they pray and work towards establishing a permanent place of worship, confident that God will provide for their needs and bring their vision to fruition.

## Discipleship & Training Initiatives

Discipleship classes were held for young converts, missionaries, and leaders. Training materials were translated into local languages. More Bibles are needed for the coming quarter.







## **MISSIONARY WELFARE**

Monthly financial support and education sponsorships were sustained, alongside virtual leadership meetings that continued to foster growth and collaboration. Many of our sponsored missionaries successfully completed their academic programs, equipping them with the skills needed for impactful ministry. These efforts reflect a commitment to bothspiritual and personal development within the mission.











### **ONLINE OUTREACHES**

Weekly Facebook prayer sessions and WhatsApp declarations continued, fostering spiritual growth and connection. Our bulletins and social media posts were consistently shared, keeping the community informed and engaged in the mission.

These platforms have proven effective in reaching and encouraging a wider audience, strengthening bonds and spreading the message of hope.







### CONCLUSION

The Gospel is marching on and we are marching with it. From remote villages to urban centers, our cry remains: "Here am I, Lord. Send me. "As we look to the second quarter, we anticipate greater exploits, deeper impact, and wider reach. We invite partners, intercessors, and friends of the ministry to continue standing with us. The fields are still ripe, and the laborers are rising. Together, let's keep taking the nations for Christ.
